

LANGUAGE ARTS

GRADE 1, GRADE 2, GRADE 3 For students currently enrolled in District 64 who participate in Math Intervention or nave an IEP. Students will work on nathematical thinking and grade level nath skills during individual, small group, and whole-class activities.

For soon-to-be 1st graders currently enrolled in District 64 who participate in Reading/Math Intervention or have an IEP. Students will improve readiness skills, ncluding listening and following lirections. Foundational reading and math kills will be reviewed and reinforced.

Registration

Registration begins Tuesday, February 20 at noon and must be completed online at the District website, www.d64.org. Access program information and registration through the "Worlds of Wonder" link.

Apply early. Many classes fill quickly! All participants must reside within the District 64 school boundaries.

Registration for BOTH sessions will close on Monday, June 3. No further registrations will be accepted after that

Students may enroll in a maximum of 2 classes per session. Some classes may be offered at only one class time — consult the Class Schedule Planner, Each class has a unique Class Number based on the time and session. Note this Class Number as it will make online registration easier.

We understand that plans may change prior to the start of summer school:

- ▶ **Before June 3,** tuition and any applicable supply fee will be refunded, subject to a 5% processing fee per class.
- **Beginning June 3,** only the tuition will be refunded, subject to a 5% processing fee per class. Any applicable supply fee will be forfeited.
- ► No refunds of any kind will be given after June 4.

If District 64 cancels a class due to insufficient enrollment, tuition and any applicable supply fee will be fully refunded.

Extended School Year (ESY)

If your child has an IEP, your child may be eligible for the Extended School Year Program (ESY). Please contact the Assistant Director of Student Services at 847-318-8122.

Transportation

Students may walk or be driven to school. Students who ride or use a bike, skateboard, or rollerblades must wear a helmet to and from school, according to District policy.

Medication at School

Most medication can and should be timed to be taken at home. If it becomes necessary for your child to take or keep medication at school, a medication form must be completed by you and your child's physician. This applies to both prescription and over-the-counter medication. The Medication Authorization Form can be found on the District website at www.d64.org or can be obtained from any school health office. Medication must be provided in a labeled prescription bottle or in original packaging.

If documentation is already on file in the school health office, no further paperwork is necessary. In the case of asthma inhalers only, parent signature is required on the medication form; however, the pharmacy label from the inhaler may substitute for the physician's signature. The label must include the student name, date, and dose and timing of medication.

▶ Please note: It is the parent/guardian's responsibility to transport the medication from the child's home school to summer school. Parents also must pick up all medication by the last day of summer school.

Emergency School Closing

The Superintendent is authorized to close Summer School in the event of hazardous weather or other emergencies that threaten the safety of students, staff members, or school property. District 64 will activate the automated phone message service to call parents/guardians when a decision to cancel school is made — typically before 6:30 a.m.
