Current Events Resources

We want to share some resources with you all. The ongoing violence in Israel and Gaza is heart wrenching. In a recent administrator newsletter from the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE), state superintendent Dr. Tony Sanders shared the following items, which we found helpful in navigating these conversations at home.

<u>The National Association of School Psychologists</u> has a downloadable flyer called <u>Supporting Youth Affected by the Violence in Israel and Gaza</u>: Tips for Families and Educators strategies for each grade level, and suggested talking points.

Additionally, from <u>Common Sense Media</u>, an article called <u>How do I talk to my kids</u> <u>about violence in the news?</u> reminds us to get a sense of what children know before launching into an explanation, by using open-ended questions, like "What did you hear?" or "What do you know?" and "What do you think about it?"

We hope these resources are helpful to you, if your children have questions at home.

If a student is leaving for an appointment, it is recommended to send a note with your child to provide to his/her classroom teacher. Students should come down to the office at their designated time; the front office will not be calling into classrooms for your student.

NOTE: As a reminder and per the D64 <u>Student-Parent Handbook</u>, <u>absences due to vacations</u>, <u>attendance at a cultural or sporting event</u>, <u>or participation in a team sport</u>, <u>acting or fine arts performance are considered unexcused</u>. Work will be given upon return for students leaving the country or immediate District area when your

children RETURN to school. It must be completed at home under a parent's supervision. Teachers are not expected to provide homework or assignments in advance for students who will be absent for an extended period of time for a family vacation and other activities.
